Novena to Saint Joseph

A novena is a prayer that is said for 9 consecutive days. Why 9 days? A simple explanation is that Jesus appeared to His disciples throughout the 40 days following his Resurrection. (Acts of the Apostles 1:4) Finally, on the day He ascended into heaven, Jesus instructed them to remain in Jerusalem until the coming of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate. That would be Pentecost, -50 days after the Resurrection. Therefore, the time between the Ascension and Pentecost would be nine days. During these nine days, the Apostles remained in prayer, eagerly petitioning the Lord for the promised gift of the Advocate. Reflecting on this mysterious instruction, we pattern some of our prayers in a like manner, and call them Novenas. In our Novena we petition Our Lord, over a period of 9 consecutive days, through the intercessions of our saints, to hear and answer our prayers, that they may be in accord with the Divine Will of God.

Prayer (novena) to Saint Joseph

*Remember oh most illustrious Patriarch St. Joseph, never has it been heard that anyone who invoked your protection or sought your mediation has not obtained relief. In this confidence I come before you, my loving protector, chaste spouse of the Virgin Mary and foster-father of the Saviour of mankind, and dispenser of the treasures of His Sacred Heart. Despise not my earnest prayer, but graciously hear and obtain my petition from God most High.
(here, mention your request, for 9 consecutive days).*

Please say the prayer to St. Joseph,

asking for his intercession and help in making repairs to our Churches.

Kindly use your 'Contingency Fund' envelope on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month.

Ushers will take up the collection before the closing prayer.
